John Foster Dulles is one of the eleven high schools in the Fort Bend Independent School District. Opened in 1959, Dulles currently serves students from several areas including the cities of Meadows Place, Missouri City and Sugar Land. These communities are situated in one of the fastest growing counties in the nation. Fort Bend ISD is the 7th largest school district in the state of Texas and a National School District of Character. - Dulles has been the home of the FBISD Math & Science Academy since 2010 where we seek to educate the current generation of students who live in a momentous era of unprecedented global innovation. Bringing students that are interested in mathematics and science together from all parts of FBISD allows us to offer a unique high school experience where students have access to math and science curricula typically not available until the university level.
- Dulles provides a strong academic program with more than 200 possible course selections including an extensive vocational-technical curriculum and options to earn college credit during the school year including 26 Advanced Placement courses enumerated on the subsequent page.
- UIL-sponsored athletic programs for young men and women are offered in football, basketball, tennis, track, soccer, golf, swimming, volleyball, baseball, softball, and gymnastics.
- Co-curricular programs include Choir, Band, Drill Team, Student Government, Service and Academic Clubs, Athletics, Academic Decathlon, and Destination Imagination.
- Gifted and Talented programs are available in English, Math, Social Studies, and Science; the honors program offers courses in English, Math, Science, Social Studies, Foreign Languages, Music, Art and Computers.
- Instruction is available for special needs through Special Education and Bilingual/ESOL instruction and 504 program.

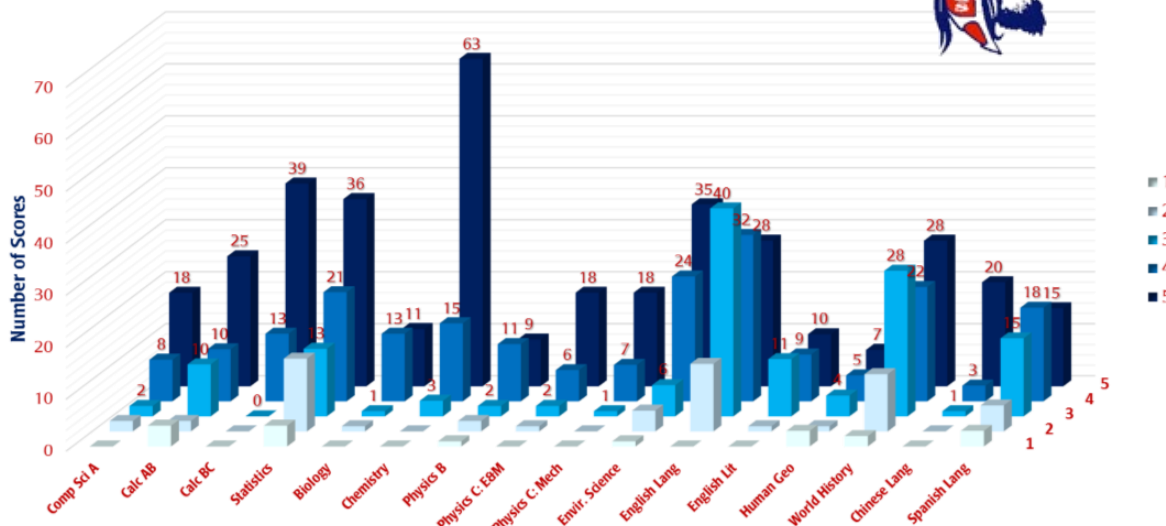
